## Fasting:

## Purpose of the fast:

We deliberately weaken the powerful bond with our flesh and strengthen our relationship with God, spirit to Spirit. It is an exchange; fasting is less of us and more of Him.

## WHAT IS HAPPENING SPIRITUALLY WHEN WE FAST?

Apostle Paul describe it so well in Romans 7, there is a perpetual battle between the flesh and the spirit, and our mind moderates by making decisions about which call to obey. As human beings, we are mind, body and spirit, but spiritually dead without God. We tend to be pushed around by our fleshly desires. Our flesh is all about our relationship with ourselves and our natural physical cravings, which can become selfish and even destructive when left unchecked.

Praying and Fasting is not our opportunity to change God's mind it's His opportunity to change us.

## Why fast?

Fasting is simply a rest from food. The word fast means strict regimen.

We fast to destroy the strongholds of evil and the yoke of bondage. We fast to usher in a great revival that will produce a spiritual harvest around us and through us. However, fasting without **repentance** defeats the purpose of the fast. (**repentance means, one makes a complete change of direction** (**180° turn**) toward God). You must first repent of all sins and be born again, according to Romans 10:9-10. This is a necessary step before fasting, humble yourself before God (**Psalm 35:13**) and confess your sins. Prayer should be our sustenance (nourishment) throughout the fast, but it is imperative we begin the

fast with a contrite heart. In other words, contrite (remorseful) A heart that is crushed over any presence of sin in your life and surrendered to the plan God has for your life.

#### **Old Testament Fast:**

- David fasted to seek God's healing for his sick child (2 Samuel 12:14-16)
- The king of Nineveh ordered every person and their animals to fast and "cry mightily to God; yes, let everyone turn from his evil way". God was moved by their reverence and showed mercy by not destroying the city. (Jonah 3:8)
- The people of Judah fasted for deliverance/help (2 Chronicles 20:3-4)

#### New Testament Fast:

- To overcome temptation (enticement) and dedicate yourself to God (Matthew 4:1 11)
- To express love and worship for God (Luke 2:37)
- (Matthew 6:16-18) "And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

#### The benefits of fasting:

Frist, it is important to know, the more seriously we approach prayer and fasting, the more serious the results we will experience.

Jesus said, "The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak" (Matt. 26:41). Fasting is a means of bringing the flesh into submission to the Lord so He can strengthen us in our mastery over our own selves. Fasting in the flesh makes us stronger to stand against the temptations of the flesh. Those temptations very often deal with food.

Abstaining from food is often God's way of showing that His desire for us is that we regain mastery over all things associated with our flesh in order to subdue our flesh and elevate our emphasis on spiritual matters.

#### The Absolute Fast:

No food but Yes to water only. No juice, coffee, tea, soda, etc. for the next seven days.

Daniel Fast:

- Fruits, Vegetables, Nuts, and Beans.
- You can drink fruit & vegetable smoothies, and water only.
- No, tea, coffee, soda, etc.

## **Day One:** Understanding Repentance - The Pathway to Transformation (Change)

# **Scripture:** Romans 3:23-24 (ESV) "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus."

## What is Repentance?

Repentance is a transformative change in heart and mind regarding sin, marked by an important vow to embrace righteousness. It is far more than just feeling guilty for past mistakes; it requires a mindful choice to change one's behavior and strive for a life that reflects God's will. This vital spiritual transformation opens the door to receiving God's forgiveness and is the first step toward true salvation.

## The Impact of Sin

The Bible explains in, **Romans 3:23-24 (ESV)** that all humans have lived in sin, which separates us from God. Without repentance, this separation continues, hindering our relationship with God and complicating the fullness of life He offers.

## **Day Two:** The Great Rescue - Salvation

Scripture: Romans 10:9-10 (ESV) "(9) because, if you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. (10) For with the heart one believes and is justified, and with the mouth, one confesses and is saved."

#### What is Salvation?

Salvation—often called being 'rescued'—is a profound spiritual rebirth. It signifies that your sins are not just forgiven but completely destroyed. This liberation comes through the powerful sacrifice of Jesus Christ, whose blood was shed on the rugged cross at Calvary. This act of infinite mercy rescues us from the dire consequences of sin.

#### The Peril of Sin

The Bible bluntly warns us about sin's lethal consequences: spiritual death, eternal separation from God, and enduring the wrath of God, manifested as unquenchable hellfire for eternity. These truths highlight the critical necessity of salvation.

## Day Three What is Forgiveness?

## Scripture: Colossians 3:13 (ESV)

Bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive."

## Vocabulary:

Forgiveness is more than just feeling okay about someone's wrong against you; it's a deliberate choice not to hold onto those wrongs. It means deciding not to keep score of the hurts you've endured. It's an action of the will—you choose to forgive!

**The Challenge of Forgiveness** It's essential to recognize that feelings like bitterness or anger might linger even after you forgive. This is particularly true for those who have suffered deep traumas such as molestation, rape, wrongful imprisonment, or abandonment in childhood. In these cases, it's crucial to continuously bring these feelings to God in prayer, seeking His deliverance. Remember, deliverance is the children's bread (Matthew 15:26). Although painful memories may haunt you, offering even these to God can help you heal.

**The Impact of Unforgiveness** Holding onto past hurts can block God's purpose intended for your life. Unforgiveness can trap you in a cycle of bitterness and vengeance, leading to setbacks and stagnation. If you dwell too much on those who have wronged you, it's like building and maintaining a space for them in your mind, which hinders your freedom.

## **The Power of Forgiveness**

Forgiveness can transform your life:

- It brings healing and joy to your spirit.
- It clears away mental pain and grudges.
- It opens the door for God to forgive you.

• It shifts you out of the victim role and reinvigorates a spirit of love and unity, as described in **1** Corinthians **13:4-8**.

Forgiving doesn't mean forgetting what happened, but it does mean releasing the control the event has over you. By forgiving, you allow God to handle the matter, freeing yourself to move forward in peace and purpose.

## Day four- Love- God is love

#### Scripture: 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 (ESV)

"(4) Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant (5) or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; (6) it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. (7) Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.
(8) Love never ends. As for prophecies, they will pass away; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will pass away."

## Vocabulary:

The English concept of "love" is a "strong affection for another," yet this singular term barely scratches the surface of its profound complexity. The ancient Greeks, in their quest to understand human emotions, articulated between four and eight distinct types of love, each capturing a unique aspect of the human experience:

## Walk in God's love child of God:

To live in the reality that God is love means to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which we have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love **(Ephesians 4:1-2)**. It encourages an ethos of love that permeates all actions, decisions, and relationships. Believers are urged to see beyond their own needs and to act in the best interests of others, serving as tangible representatives of God's love on earth.

## **Expressions of God's Love**

#### 1. Creation:

**Scripture**: **Genesis 1:31** - "God saw all that he had made, and it was very good." This verse highlights the perfection and care God put into creation, reflecting His love through the environment He prepared for humanity.

#### 2. Covenant:

**Scripture**: **Genesis 9:13** - "I have set my rainbow in the clouds, and it will be the sign of the covenant between me and the earth." This promise after the flood is a testament to God's enduring commitment and love for His creation, despite human shortcomings.

#### 3. Sacrifice:

**Scripture**: **Romans 5:8** - "But God demonstrates His love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." This passage highlights the sacrificial nature of God's love, showing that His love is proactive and unconditional.

#### 4. Presence:

**Scripture**: **Matthew 28:20** - "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Here, Jesus promises His continual presence, which is fulfilled through the Holy Spirit, representing God's ongoing commitment and love for His people.

## **Different types of Love:**

- 1. Storge (STORE-gay): The natural affection often found between family members.
- 2. Philia or Phileo (FILL-ee-uh or FILL-ee-oh): The deep bond of friendship.
- 3. Eros (AIR-ose): Passionate, romantic love.
- 4. Agape (uh-GAH-pay): Selfless, unconditional love; the highest form of love which is divine.
- 5. Ludus (LOO-dus): Playful, flirtatious love without commitment.
- 6. Pragma (PRAG-ma): Love built on commitment, understanding, and long-term interests.
- 7. **Philautia** (fill-AW-tee-uh): Self-love, which can be healthy or unhealthy.
- 8. Mania (MAY-nee-uh): Obsessive love, marked by dependency and possessiveness.

## Day Five- Pray for Your Enemies: When Betrayal Cuts Deep

#### Scripture:

Luke 6:27-36 (ESV)

"But I say to you who hear, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you."

## Vocabulary for the Word - Enemy

- 1. Adversary
  - Meaning: Someone who opposes or fights against you.
  - Example: "David faced his adversary, Goliath, with faith in God."

  - Meaning: Someone competing for the same goal or in opposition.
  - Example: "Jealousy turned Saul into David's rival, even though David remained loyal."

## 5. Antagonist

- Meaning: Someone actively working against or opposing another.
- **Example**: "In spiritual warfare, the devil is the ultimate antagonist."
- 6. Persecutor
  - **Meaning**: Someone who mistreats or oppresses others, often due to their beliefs or differences.
  - **Example**: "Jesus taught us to pray for our persecutors, showing them love and forgiveness."

## 7. Nemesis

- Meaning: A long-standing rival or an agent of retribution.
- **Example**: "For years, he considered his nemesis to be unbeatable until he relied on God's strength."
- 8. **Oppressor** 
  - Meaning: Someone who unjustly exerts authority or control over others.
  - **Example**: "God is a refuge for the oppressed, protecting them from their oppressors."
- 9. Hater
  - Meaning: Someone who harbors deep dislike or hostility.
  - Example: "Jesus calls us to love even those who act as haters toward us."
- 10. Betrayer
  - Meaning: Someone who turns against or deceives a friend or ally.
  - Example: "Judas is known as the betrayer of Jesus, yet Jesus still showed him love."

## When the Enemy is Someone You Love

Few things sting more than discovering that someone you trusted—a best friend, a family member, or even a spouse—has been working against you. The betrayal feels like a dagger to the heart, leaving you questioning everything: *Was anything real? Why would they hurt me? How do I move forward from this?* 

When the person you once confided in, leaned on and loved turns out to be an adversary, it's not just anger that rises—it's a deep, cutting grief. The wounds of betrayal often leave scars that words can't explain. For some, it feels like their world has been shattered into pieces too broken to repair.

- A Best Friend's Betrayal: You shared your secrets, dreams, and fears, only to find out they were using them against you. The pain of realizing that the person who knew you best has hurt you cuts to the core.
- A Family Member's Deception: Family is supposed to have your back, to be your safe space. But when you find out that a sibling, cousin, or parent has acted out of jealousy or hatred, the trust you once had crumbled, leaving a void that feels impossible to fill.
- The Hurt of a Spouse's Betrayal: When a husband or wife—the one person you vowed to love and cherish—becomes the source of your greatest pain, it shakes your sense of identity and safety. You wonder if the love was ever real or if their actions were meant to destroy the very foundation of your life.

## The Call to Love and Pray

Jesus' words in Luke 6:27-36 seem almost impossible in these moments. "Love your enemies? Do good to those who hate you? Bless those who curse you?" How can you love the person who caused you this much pain? How can you pray for someone who seemed to delight in your suffering?

The truth is, Jesus never promised this would be easy. But He showed us the way. While hanging on the cross, betrayed and abandoned by those He loved, He prayed, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). If Jesus can pray for those who nailed Him to a cross, we too can find the strength to pray for those who have betrayed us.

## How to Pray When the Pain Feels Too Much

- 1. **Start with Honesty**: Tell God how much it hurts. He already knows, but He wants you to pour out your heart to Him. "*Lord, I feel broken and angry. I don't know how to forgive, but I know You can help me.*"
- 2. Ask for God's Help: Forgiveness and love don't come naturally when you've been deeply hurt. Pray for the strength to release the pain and begin the healing process.
- 3. **Pray for Their Transformation**: This doesn't mean excusing their behavior, but it means asking God to change their heart and bring them closer to Him.
- 4. **Pray for Your Healing**: Ask God to mend your heart and help you find peace, even if the situation remains unresolved.

## **Reflection: Why Pray for Someone Who Hurt You?**

- 1. **Prayer Sets You Free**: Forgiveness doesn't mean what they did was okay. It means you're choosing not to let their actions control your heart.
  - Matthew 5:44: "But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you."
- 2. **Prayer Changes Hearts**: Your prayer can soften their heart and invite God's power into the situation.
  - Romans 12:21: "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good."
- 3. **Prayer Honors God**: By praying for those who hurt you, you show that your faith is in God's justice, not your ability to make things right.

Father, I ask for Your healing over my heart. Mend the broken places and fill me with Your peace. Help me to trust You with my pain and to believe that You will bring justice in Your time. Let Your love flow through me so that I can move forward in freedom and grace.

- The way we respond to our enemies reveals the condition of our hearts.

## **Day Six-** Pray for the Senior Pastor/Servant and family

The word Pastor is defined as:

A shepherd, is someone who takes care of a flock. In a Biblical context, this means a pastor is responsible for caring for and guiding a church's congregation, much like a shepherd with sheep. The pastor's duties include teaching the congregation about the Christian faith and ensuring their spiritual well-being.

#### What does the bible say about Pastors:

#### Scripture:

Jeremiah 3:15 And I will give you pastors according to mine heart, which shall feed you with knowledge and understanding.

**1 Thessalonians 5: 12–13** And now, friends, we ask you to honor those leaders who work so hard for you, who have been given the responsibility of urging and guiding you along in your obedience. Overwhelm them with appreciation and love!

The statistics regarding pastors considering leaving their ministry roles are sourced from a study by the Barna Group. Here are the key findings from this study:

- Increase in Pastors Considering Leaving: From late 2021 to March 2022, the percentage of pastors thinking about stepping down from their church roles rose from 38% to 42%.
- **Reasons for Considering Leaving**: The main reasons cited include the immense stress of the job, feelings of loneliness, and the impact of political divisions within the church community.

## **Pastors Get Frustrated Too:**

#### What Does it Mean to Frustrate the Pastor?

To frustrate a pastor means to cause discouragement, stress, or even weariness by resisting their leadership, neglecting responsibilities, or failing to live according to God's Word that he/she teaches. Pastors are spiritual shepherds (soul watchers) tasked with guiding, teaching, and caring for their congregation. When the people they lead choose disobedience, division, or complacency, it can make the pastor's work heavy and disheartening.

This frustration doesn't only happen today—it's seen in the Bible, where many leaders faced similar challenges, including Moses and Jeremiah.

## **Biblical Leaders Who Were Frustrated by the People's Disobedience**

- 1. Moses
  - **Example**: Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt toward the Promised Land, but their constant complaining, rebellion, and lack of faith deeply frustrated him.
  - Key Moment: In Numbers 20:10-12, Moses became so frustrated with the people's grumbling about water that he struck the rock instead of speaking to it as God commanded. This act of disobedience cost Moses the chance to enter the Promised Land.
  - Why He Was Frustrated: The people repeatedly doubted God's provision and leadership, even after witnessing miracles like the parting of the Red Sea and manna from heaven.
- 2. Jeremiah
  - **Example**: Known as the "weeping prophet," & (major prophet) Jeremiah faced immense frustration because the people of Judah refused to listen to his warnings about God's judgment.
  - **Key Moment**: In **Jeremiah 20:7-9**, Jeremiah expressed his frustration with the people and even with God, saying, "You deceived me, Lord, and I was deceived... the word of the Lord has brought me insult and reproach all day long."
  - Why He Was Frustrated: Despite his faithfulness, the people mocked, rejected, and persecuted him for delivering God's messages.

## 3. Elijah

- **Example**: After standing boldly against the prophets of Baal, Elijah became frustrated and discouraged when he felt alone in his devotion to God.
- **Key Moment**: In **1 Kings 19:4**, Elijah prayed, "I have had enough, Lord. Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors."
- Why He Was Frustrated: Elijah felt isolated and unsupported, believing he was the only one still faithful to God.

## 4. Nehemiah

- **Example**: Nehemiah worked tirelessly to rebuild Jerusalem's walls, but he faced opposition not only from external enemies but also from the people's disobedience.
- **Key Moment**: In **Nehemiah 13:25**, Nehemiah became so frustrated with the people's disobedience regarding intermarriage that he rebuked them harshly and even pulled out some of their hair.
- Why He Was Frustrated: Despite all God had done for them, the people continued to break His laws.

## 5. Jesus

- **Example**: Jesus, though sinless, experienced frustration with the stubbornness and lack of faith among His followers and others.
- Key Moment: In Mark 9:19, Jesus said, "You unbelieving generation, how long shall I stay with you? How long shall I put up with you?"
- Why He Was Frustrated: Despite His teachings and miracles, many people still lacked faith and understanding.

## Practical ways to make pastoring easy for your leader:

- 1. **Grow Spiritually**: Continually develop your relationship with God using the resources available to you.
- 2. **Understand Your Pastor**: Take the time to understand your pastor's personality, vision, and heart. Don't be offended and allow your pastor he/she to be who God created them to be.
- 3. Stay Open-minded: Be willing to learn and consider new ideas and perspectives.

- Promote Your Church: Share information about your church with others and invite them to attend services and events. (like share and comment on all church social media platforms, Facebook, Instagram, YouTube & TikTok)
- Embrace Creativity: Support new initiatives and avoid dismissing them with phrases like "we've always done it this way."
- 6. Value Contributions Properly: Understand that financial contributions don't entitle you to influence church decisions or demand the pastor's attention.
- 7. Witness in the Community: Actively share your faith with neighbors and in the workplace.
- 8. Keep Criticism Constructive: Avoid speaking negatively about your pastor or church publicly; discuss any issues directly with your pastor.
- 9. Avoid Comparisons: Don't hold your pastor to the standards or practices of their predecessors; appreciate their unique contributions and current work.
- 10. **Don't Make Job Comparisons**: Understand that pastoral work differs greatly from secular jobs regarding responsibilities, pressures, and rewards.
- 11. Show Appreciation: Regularly affirm the value of your pastor's work and express your support.
- 12. Pray: Regularly pray for your pastor, recognizing the spiritual challenges and risks they face.
- 13. Understand the Spiritual Battle: Be mindful that your pastor could be under spiritual attack and that your prayers play a crucial role in their defense.

#### What is Praise?

Praise means expressing gratitude and admiration. It's about glorifying and celebrating what's good, especially the incredible acts of God.

#### **Vocabulary:**

Transform- refers to making a thorough or dramatic change in form, appearance, or character.

Understanding praise will change your praise posture:

- Spiritual Armor and Weaponry: Praise serves as both a shield and a weapon in spiritual battles. In the Bible, the book of Psalms often depicts praise as a fortress or refuge that protects believers from spiritual attacks. For example, Psalm 59:16-17 describes singing of God's strength and praising His power as a morning ritual that provides protection and peace.
- 2. Shifts Focus from Problems to Provider: During times of spiritual warfare, praise helps shift the believer's focus from the challenges at hand to the sovereignty and goodness of God. This change in focus can bring about a spiritual realignment, where trust and faith in God are strengthened, as seen in Psalm 42 where amidst deep despair, the psalmist chooses to praise God, expecting His deliverance.

- 3. **Invites God's Presence**: Praise invites God's presence. According to Psalms 22:3, God inhabits the praises of His people. In spiritual warfare, the presence of God brought on by praise ensures God's power is at hand to combat spiritual adversities.
- 4. **Breaks Spiritual Strongholds**: Praise can lead to miraculous interventions that break spiritual strongholds. A prime example is found in 2 Chronicles 20, where Jehoshaphat and the people of Judah were told to face a great enemy. By obeying God's instruction to go to the battlefield with praise, they witnessed their adversaries being defeated without having to fight.
- 5. **Creates Joy and Strength**: Nehemiah 8:10 mentions, "the joy of the Lord is your strength." In the context of spiritual warfare, the joy derived from praising God can be a source of inner strength that sustains the believer through trials and tribulations.

**Not Direct Punishment**: The Bible also teaches that not all sickness is a direct result of an individual's sin. Jesus made it clear that sickness can serve a divine purpose, such as God's glory being displayed in someone's healing.

• Scripture: (John 9:1-3) "As he passed by, he saw a man blind from birth. And his disciples asked him, 'Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?' Jesus answered, 'It was not that this man sinned, or his parents, but that the works of God might be displayed in him.'"

**Romans 5:12** explains how sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all people because all sinned.

This assurance underscores that the Holy Spirit's role goes beyond mere presence; it is a dynamic and powerful influence that fills believers, guiding and strengthening them in their mission and spiritual growth.

#### **Biblical Teaching Clarified (The Holy Spirit/The Holy Ghost):**

 Guidance: In John 16:13, Jesus explains that the Holy Spirit will guide believers into all truth. He states, "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come."

- Filled with the Holy Spirit: Ephesians 5:18 advises believers to be "filled with the Spirit," which is often interpreted as allowing oneself to be influenced by the Holy Spirit's power and presence. Being filled with the Spirit enhances one's ability to live according to God's will but does not mean being controlled against one's will.
- 3. **Fruit of the Spirit:** Galatians 5:22-23 describes the "fruit of the Spirit," which includes love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These characteristics teach that the Spirit's influence leads to voluntary expression of these virtues rather than forced control over one's actions.

## Day Eleven (Part 2) Pray to receive the infilling of the Holy Spirit

## What stops a believer from being filled with the Holy Spirit / Holy Ghost?

## 1. Living in Continuous Sin:

Engaging in behaviors that are clearly against God's teachings. This could include habitual lying, stealing, harboring bitterness, or any other persistent conduct that contradicts biblical values.

## 2. Surrender to Fleshly Desires:

Allowing one's life to be dominated by earthly desires and passions such as greed, jealousy, rage, and other impulses that the Bible often refers to as the "works of the flesh" (Galatians 5:19-21).

## 3. Spiritual Apathy (Indifference):

Displaying indifference or lack of concern towards spiritual growth, neglecting prayer, Bible study, and fellowship with other believers. This can lead to a stagnation or decline in one's faith.

## Speaking in tongues & the infilling of the Holy Spirit/Holy Ghost:

- Biblical Evidence: The New Testament provides clear instances of speaking in tongues accompanying the infilling of the Holy Spirit, marking significant moments in the early Church's history. On the day of Pentecost, as described in Acts 2:4, the apostles received the Holy Spirit and began speaking in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. This phenomenon served as a powerful sign of the Holy Spirit's presence and was witnessed again in Acts 10:46 and Acts 19:6.
- 2. **Purpose and Function**: Speaking in tongues serves primarily as a means for personal edification and direct communication with God. Paul explains in 1 Corinthians 14:2 that one who speaks in tongues speaks not to men but to God, for no one understands him, but he utters mysteries in the Spirit. This spiritual language enhances the believer's connection to God, allowing for expressions that transcend human understanding.
- 3. **Gift for Building Up**: While speaking in tongues can also act as a sign for non-believers, its principal role within the church is to build up the individual believer. 1 Corinthians 14:4 underscores that one who

speaks in a tongue edifies himself. This gift, therefore, contributes to the spiritual growth and strength of the individual, reinforcing their faith.

4. **One Among Many Gifts**: It is crucial to recognize that speaking in tongues, while valuable, is just one of many gifts given by the Holy Spirit. As outlined in 1 Corinthians 12:4-11, the Spirit bestows a variety of gifts, including wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, and prophecy, each intended to benefit the church's communal life and mission.

## Application (The Seek) for the Holy Spirit/ Holy Ghost:

- 1. **Surrender and Confession**: Begin with a heart open to God, confessing any known sins and surrendering your life fully to Jesus Christ. This prepares your heart to receive the Holy Spirit by removing barriers of sin and disobedience.
- Desire and Ask: Express a deep desire for the infilling of the Holy Spirit. Luke 11:13 says, "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" Simply put, ask God in prayer to fill you with His Spirit.
- Faith: Believe that God wants to fill you with His Holy Spirit. Faith is essential in receiving from God.
   Hebrews 11:6 states, "And without faith, it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him."
- 4. **Obedience and Submission**: Live a life in obedience to God's commandments. **Acts 5:32** notes that God gives the Holy Spirit to those who obey Him. Being willing to submit to God's will and follow His ways is crucial.
  - 5. Continual Seeking and Fellowship: Persistently seek a deeper relationship with God through prayer, worship, reading the Bible, and fellowship with other believers. Ephesians 5:18-19 encourages believers not just to be filled once but to continue being filled by engaging with the community in worship and spiritual practices.
- 6. Expectation and Reception: Approach God with expectation, and be ready to receive. Sometimes, the infilling of the Holy Spirit is accompanied by physical sensations, emotions, or nothing at all initially—focus on God's promise more than the physical manifestations.

## 6. Rulers of the Darkness of this World

- **Meaning**: Demons that control daily operations of darkness and deception.
- Scripture: Ephesians 6:12 "...against the rulers of the darkness of this world..."

## 7. Spiritual Wickedness in High Places

- **Meaning**: Demonic forces operating in the realms of high spiritual authority to promote rebellion against God.
- Scripture: Ephesians 6:12 "...against spiritual wickedness in high places."

## 1. Belt of Truth:

- **Application**: Embrace honesty and integrity in all your dealings. Let truth guide your words and actions, helping you to avoid deception and make decisions that align with God's Word.



- 2. **Support and Growth**: In **Romans 12:5**, we learn, "so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others." We are made to support each other. This connection helps us grow in faith and face life's challenges together.
- 3. **Powerful Witness**: The unity of the Body of Christ stands as a powerful witness to the world about God's love and power. When we live in harmony, we show the world what God's kingdom looks like.
- 4. **Continuing Jesus' Mission**: **Ephesians 4:12-13** teaches us that the Body of Christ is here to build up the church and achieve unity in faith, becoming mature followers of Jesus. This is how we continue what Jesus started.

The Body of Christ is not just a group of people who believe in Jesus. It is an active and organized family, deeply rooted in God's plan and washed in the blood of Jesus.

## **Day Fourteen:** Praying Against the Spirit of Setback

#### Vocabulary:

• Setback: A reversal, delay, or obstacle that hinders progress. Spiritually, it can represent an attack against believers to block their purpose, disrupt their growth, and frustrate their faith.

Setbacks often feel like taking one step forward and two steps back. You make progress, but suddenly everything seems to go wrong. Spiritually, setbacks can be an attempt by the enemy to delay or discourage you from walking in God's promises. This is not just coincidence; it is a strategy of "anti-progress" designed to hinder the plans of God in your life.

#### Scripture Focus: Daniel 10:11-13

In this passage, Daniel had been praying and fasting for understanding. His prayer was heard from the very first day, but there was a delay in the answer. The delay wasn't because God ignored him, but because a spiritual battle was taking place in the unseen realm. The prince of Persia, a demonic force, resisted the angel bringing Daniel's answer. However, Michael, a chief angel, came to help, and the message finally got through.

#### Key Lessons from the Scripture:

- 1. **God Hears You Right Away**: Verse 12 reassures us that God hears our prayers immediately when we come to Him with a humble heart and a sincere desire to understand His will.
- 2. **Delays Are Not Denials**: The delay in Daniel's answer was not a "no" from God but a result of spiritual opposition. This reminds us that spiritual battles often occur when we pray.
- 3. **God Sends Help**: Just as Michael was sent to assist in the heavenly battle, God provides divine help to overcome the enemy's attempts to block or delay us.

#### **Recognizing the Spirit of Setback**:

- Patterns of Delay: Constant interruptions or issues just when progress is within reach.
- Unexplained Hindrances: Obstacles arise without a clear cause, blocking plans, growth, or success.
- Emotional Frustration: Feelings of despair, discouragement, or wanting to give up when facing repeated challenges.

**Setbacks** can attack your relationships, finances, career, or spiritual growth. However, these challenges are not beyond God's control. Through prayer, faith, and persistence, you can overcome the spirit of setback.

#### Practical Steps to Overcome Setback:

1. **Pray Without Ceasing**: Follow Daniel's example of persistence. Even when it feels like nothing is happening, keep praying and trusting God to work behind the scenes.

1 Thessalonians 5:17: "Pray without ceasing."

2. **Declare God's Promises**: Speak God's Word over your life. Declare victory and progress in every area under attack.

Isaiah 54:17: "No weapon formed against you shall prosper."

3. **Stay Humble and Aligned**: Daniel's heart was humble and aligned with God's will. Ask God to examine your heart and remove anything that might hinder His plans for your life.

*Psalm 139:23-24*: "Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts."

4. **Trust God's Timing**: Remember, God's timing is perfect. Delays often serve a purpose beyond what we can see.

*Romans 8:28*: "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

5. Warfare Prayer: Engage in prayers specifically targeting spiritual hindrances and setbacks.

# **Day Fifteen:** Praying to Break Generational Curses and Embrace Generational Blessings

#### Scripture:

#### Exodus 20:5-6

"You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I, the Lord your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments."

• Key Insight: This passage highlights the consequences of sin affecting future generations but also emphasizes God's mercy and love for those who turn to Him.

#### Vocabulary:

**Generational -** Generational means something that is passed down from one generation to the next, such as traits, habits, traditions, or even problems.

A generational curse is a spiritual pattern of suffering, sin, or calamity that is passed down through family lines. These curses are often the result of ancestral disobedience to God and can manifest as cycles of poverty, sickness, addictions, or broken relationships. However, the Bible is clear: through

Jesus Christ, every curse can be broken and destroyed. Thus, believers can step into **generational blessings**—God's promises of favor, peace, and abundance for families that walk in obedience to Him.

God's Word declares that no curse is too strong for Him to break, and no chain is too heavy for Him to destroy. As **Isaiah 45:2-3 promises:** 

"I will go before thee, and make the crooked places straight: I will break in pieces the gates of brass, and cut in sunder the bars of iron: And I will give thee the treasures of darkness, and hidden riches of secret places, that thou mayest know that I, the Lord, which call thee by thy name, am the God of Israel."

#### Galatians 3:13

- "Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law, having become a curse for us (for it is written, 'Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree')."
- This scripture reveals that Jesus has already broken the power of every curse through His death. His sacrifice removes the spiritual chains that may have bound us due to past generations.

#### **Understanding Generational Curses**

Generational curses **manifest (display)** in various forms, such as:

- Persistent cycles of poverty, addictions, or family dysfunction.
- Repeated struggles with similar sins or failures across multiple generations.
- Chronic illnesses or emotional burdens that seem "inherited."

#### Steps to Break & Destroy Generational Curses

- 1. Acknowledge the Patterns
  - Reflect on your family history. Are there recurring struggles or sins that seem to affect multiple generations? Identifying these patterns is the first step to addressing them.
- 2. Confess and Renounce
  - Confess any known sins in your family line, both personal and generational. Renounce any alignment with sinful practices or behaviors. *1 John 1:9* promises, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

#### 3. Claim Your Redemption Through Christ

 Declare that through Jesus' sacrifice on the cross, you are no longer bound by the curses of the past. Galatians 3:13 assures us that Christ has redeemed us from the curse of the law.

#### 4. Replace the Curse with God's Blessing

- Ask God to replace the areas of curse with His blessings of peace, prosperity, health, and spiritual growth. Pray for God's promises to be established in your life and your family line.
- 5. Stay Aligned with God
  - Generational blessings require a life that honors God. *Deuteronomy 7:9* says, "Know therefore that the Lord your God is God; He is the faithful God, keeping His covenant of love to a thousand generations of those who love Him and keep His commandments."

#### What Does It Mean to Break a Curse?

To **break** a generational curse means to:

- Sever its Hold: Breaking a curse is like cutting a chain. It stops the curse's power and influence over your life. Through prayer and repentance, the legal authority the enemy has over you or your family is removed.
- **Declare Freedom**: When you break a curse, you are declaring that its power is null and void through the authority of Jesus Christ.

#### • Spiritual Application:

- *Isaiah 58:6*: "Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo the straps of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke?"
- Prayer, fasting, and declaring God's promises are key ways to break curses.

#### Why Do We Break and Destroy Generational Curses?

Generational curses, rooted in sin or disobedience from past generations, can create patterns of struggle, failure, and bondage in families. As believers, we are called to break and destroy these curses to live in the freedom and blessings Jesus provides. Breaking and destroying generational curses ensures that we align our lives and families with God's promises, replacing cycles of pain and defeat with victory and restoration.

## The fruit of Pettiness

#### Why Pettiness Causes a Stumbling Block in Marriages

Pettiness refers to focusing on trivial matters or holding grudges over small offenses. While seemingly insignificant, pettiness can create significant stumbling blocks in marriage because it undermines the foundations of love, respect, and forgiveness.

#### . Pettiness Creates Division

When one or both spouses focus on minor issues—like forgetting to put the cap on the toothpaste or not folding the laundry a certain way—it can create unnecessary tension. These small irritations, when not addressed with grace, can snowball into larger conflicts, creating emotional distance.

#### The Call to Prayer and Fasting

God calls His people to prayer and fasting as a way to seek Him earnestly, break spiritual strongholds, and align ourselves with His will. This is not just an individual act but a corporate practice, as seen in the Bible:

- **Example**: The church in Antioch fasted and prayed before sending Paul and Barnabas on their missionary journey.

  - o 1 Thessalonians 5:17: "Pray without ceasing."
- 2. Meditate on God's Word

- Spend time reading and reflecting on Scripture. Allow the Holy Spirit to reveal truths that strengthen your spirit.
- Joshua 1:8: "Keep this Book of the Law always on your lips; meditate on it day and night."

#### 3. Engage in Worship

- Use worship songs to focus your heart on God's greatness. Worship helps shift your perspective from physical hunger to spiritual fulfillment.
- Psalm 95:6: "Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker."

#### Vocabulary

- Key Insight: Sexual immorality is a sin against the temple of the Holy Spirit—our bodies—and it must be abandoned to honor God.

## **Steps to Renounce Sexual Sins**

## **Root Causes of Sexual Sins**

Sexual sins often stem from deeper issues that go beyond physical desires. Understanding these root causes can help believers address the underlying problems and find freedom through Christ. Here are some common root causes:

#### 1. Lust and Fleshly Desires

- **Cause**: A strong craving for physical pleasure or gratification outside of God's design for sexual intimacy.

In the story of the woman with the issue of blood, her journey of faith began with sound.

 Mark 5:27: "She had heard the reports about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his garment."

Her faith was activated by what she heard about Jesus. She heard that He healed the sick, gave sight to the blind, and made the lame walk. This sound of faith stirred her heart, ignited her belief, and gave her the courage to act.

#### Faith Speaks: The Language of Faith

Faith has a language, and it speaks with confidence in God's ability to deliver.

• Mark 5:28: "For she said, 'If I touch even his garments, I will be made well."

The woman declared her faith with her words: "*If I could just touch Him.*" Her declaration reflected her belief in Jesus' power to heal. Words of faith have power because they align with God's promises.

• Proverbs 18:21: "Death and life are in the power of the tongue."

When we speak faith-filled words, we invite God's power into our lives.

#### Faith Moves: Faith Without Works is Dead

Faith isn't just about hearing and speaking—it requires action. The woman with the issue of blood didn't sit back and hope for healing; she moved forward, despite her condition and the obstacles in her way.

• James 2:17: "So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead."

She forged ahead, pushing through the crowd, even though her condition made her an outcast. She risked public shame, rejection, and even punishment, but her faith propelled her forward.

#### Faith Breaks Through Obstacles

The woman's journey to Jesus was not easy. The crowd was thick, and her physical condition made it hard to move, but she pressed on.

 Mark 5:30-34: When she touched Jesus' garment, He immediately knew that power had gone out from Him. Despite the crowd, He acknowledged her faith, saying, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace and be healed of your disease."

#### Her faith moved her to overcome every obstacle to receive her breakthrough.
