Fasting:

Purpose of the fast:

We deliberately weaken the powerful bond with our flesh and strengthen our relationship with God, spirit to Spirit. It is an exchange; fasting is less of us and more of Him.

WHAT IS HAPPENING SPIRITUALLY WHEN WE FAST?

Apostle Paul describe it so well in Romans 7, there is a perpetual battle between the flesh and the spirit, and our mind moderates by making decisions about which call to obey. As human beings, we are mind, body and spirit, but spiritually dead without God. We tend to be pushed around by our fleshly desires. Our flesh is all about our relationship with ourselves and our natural physical cravings, which can become selfish and even destructive when left unchecked.

Praying and Fasting is not our opportunity to change God's mind it's His opportunity to change us.

Why fast?

Fasting is simply a rest from food. The word fast means strict regimen. We fast to destroy the strongholds of evil and the yoke of bondage. We fast to usher in a great revival that will produce a spiritual harvest around us and through us. However, fasting without **repentance** defeats the purpose of the fast. (**repentance means, one makes a complete change of direction (180° turn) toward God.**) You must first repent of all sins and be born again, according to Romans 10:9-10. This is a necessary step before fasting, humble yourself before God (**Psalm 35:13**) and confess your sins. Prayer should be our sustenance (nourishment) throughout the fast, but it is imperative we begin the fast with a contrite heart. In other words, contrite (remorseful) A heart that is crushed over any presence of sin in your life and surrendered to the plan God has for your life.

Old Testament Fast:

- David fasted to seek God's healing for his sick child (**2 Samuel 12:14-16**)

- The king of Nineveh ordered every person and their animals to fast and "cry mightily to God; yes, let everyone turn from his evil way". God was moved by their reverence and showed mercy by not destroying the city. (**Jonah 3:8**)
- The people of Judah fasted for deliverance/help (**2 Chronicles 20:3-4**)

New Testament Fast:

- To overcome temptation (enticement) and dedicate yourself to God (**Matthew 4:1 – 11**)
- To express love and worship for God (**Luke 2:37**)
- (**Matthew 6:16-18**) "And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you."

The benefits of fasting:

First, it is important to know, the more seriously we approach prayer and fasting, the more serious the results we will experience.

Jesus said, "The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak" (**Matt. 26:41**). Fasting is a means of bringing the flesh into submission to the Lord so He can strengthen us in our mastery over our own selves. Fasting in the flesh makes us stronger to stand against the temptations of the flesh. Those temptations very often deal with food.

Abstaining from food is often God's way of showing that His desire for us is that we regain mastery over all things associated with our flesh in order to subdue our flesh and elevate our emphasis on spiritual matters.

The Absolute Fast:

No food but **Yes** to water only. **No** juice, coffee, tea, soda, etc. for the next **seven days**.

Daniel Fast:

- Fruits, Vegetables, Nuts, and Beans.
- You can drink fruit & vegetable smoothies, and water only.

No, tea, coffee, soda, etc.

DAY 1 SALVATION

Encouraging Words from Cornell C. S. Wheeler (Servant)

This day we are studying Salvation. Read the full chapter connected to today's scripture. Ask God to help you understand salvation clearly and share it with someone else.

STORY ABOUT SALVATION:

Marcus was on his way home from work when he noticed a man sitting alone at the bus stop. The man looked tired, his shoulders heavy, his eyes fixed on the ground. Marcus felt a gentle tug in his heart, a quiet thought that said, *Stop and speak.*

At first, Marcus hesitated. He didn't know what to say. He wasn't a preacher. He didn't have a microphone or a pulpit. But he remembered that witnessing wasn't about having the perfect words. It was about sharing the truth he had already received.

Marcus walked over and said, "Hey, how are you doing today?"
The man looked up, surprised, and said, "Honestly, not good."

They talked for a few minutes. The man shared how life felt empty, how he felt lost, and how he didn't know what came next after all his mistakes. Marcus listened. Then he shared his own story. He told him how he once felt the same way until he learned that Jesus didn't come to condemn him, but to save him.

Marcus said, "I found out that salvation isn't about being perfect. It's about believing that Jesus died for our sins and rose again so we could have new life. When I believed that, everything changed."

The man asked, "So you're saying Jesus would forgive someone like me?"

Marcus smiled and said, “Yes. That’s exactly who He came for.”

Right there at the bus stop, Marcus asked the man if he wanted to pray. The man nodded. Marcus led him in a simple prayer, asking Jesus to come into his heart and take control of his life.

When the prayer ended, the man looked different. Not because all his problems were gone, but because hope had entered his heart. Marcus reminded him that salvation was the beginning, not the end, and encouraged him to keep learning God’s Word.

As Marcus walked away, he realized something important. He didn’t just share words. He shared **life**. That day, Marcus understood that witnessing is simply telling others what Jesus has already done for you and inviting them to receive it too.

Allowing God to reshape the way you think happens when you intentionally submit your thoughts to His Word and His Spirit. It begins with listening to what God says instead of agreeing with old beliefs, fears, or past experiences. As you read Scripture, pray, and obey conviction, God replaces harmful thinking with truth. This process requires humility, consistency, and a willingness to let go of thoughts that no longer align with who God is calling you to be. Over time, the mind learns to respond with faith, clarity, and obedience instead of habit or emotion.

The Spirit helps correct, strengthen, and lead into truth, making it possible to live a life that honors God. Walking after the Spirit produces peace, clarity, and a lifestyle that reflects Christ.

DAY 4 FILLED WITH THE HOLY GHOST

“Endued With Power”

Jasmine was saved and loved the Lord. She believed in Jesus Christ, attended church faithfully, and desired to live a life that pleased God. Yet she noticed something missing. When trials came, her strength seemed to fade. When temptation appeared, she struggled to stand firm. She realized that salvation had brought her into relationship with God, but she needed power to walk out that life daily.

During a tarrying service, the Word of God was taught concerning the promise of the Holy Ghost. The teacher explained that the Holy Ghost is not a feeling or an emotional moment, but the Spirit of God given to believers to empower them to live holy, overcome sin, and be witnesses for Christ. Jasmine listened attentively as she heard that receiving the Holy Ghost required surrender, obedience, and faith in God's promise.

That night, Jasmine went before the Lord in prayer. She repented of anything the Holy Spirit had been convicting her of. She forgave those she had held in her heart. She laid down distractions and made herself available to God. She did not rush the moment. She waited with expectation.

As she prayed and worshiped, something shifted. The presence of God filled the room. Peace replaced anxiety. Strength replaced weakness. The Spirit of God came upon her just as the Word declared. Jasmine understood that she was no longer striving in her own ability. She was endued with power from on high.

From that day forward, Jasmine walked differently. The Holy Ghost gave her boldness to stand for righteousness. He guided her decisions, corrected her when needed, and strengthened her in moments of weakness. She learned that the Holy Ghost does not remove responsibility, but He empowers obedience.

Jasmine's life became a testimony. She understood that salvation is the door, but the Holy Ghost is the power to walk through life victoriously. She learned that when a believer is filled with the Holy Ghost, they are equipped to live holy, serve faithfully, and stand strong until the return of Christ.

This day we are studying Closing Demonic Doors. Read the full chapter connected to today's scripture. Ask God to reveal any doors opened knowingly or unknowingly and give you strength to close them through repentance and obedience.

“The Door I Didn’t Know Was Open”

Darius loved God and had recently recommitted his life to Christ. He prayed, read his Bible, and wanted to live right. Yet he noticed that certain struggles kept returning. Anger flared up quickly. Temptation felt stronger than it should. His peace came and went. He could not understand why victory felt so difficult when he truly wanted to obey God.

One evening during Bible study, the lesson focused on giving no place to the devil. The teacher explained that demonic doors are often opened through sin, compromise, or curiosity with things God has clearly warned against. The teacher said, “The enemy does not need permission to tempt you, but he does need access to stay.”

Those words stayed with Darius. As he prayed that night, the Holy Spirit began to reveal areas he had ignored. He remembered how he used to watch certain movies that glorified darkness. He had listened to music that fed lust and anger. He had dabbled in things he once thought were harmless, but God showed him they were doors, not entertainment.

Darius realized something important. He had not lost his salvation, but he had given the enemy room to operate.

With humility, Darius repented. He did not excuse his actions or blame others. He prayed, “Lord, I renounce and denounce every door I opened knowingly or unknowingly. I choose obedience over curiosity. I choose holiness over comfort.”

He removed what God told him to remove. He changed what God told him to change. He did not argue with conviction. He obeyed it.

Over time, things began to shift. His mind felt clearer. Temptation lost its grip. Peace settled where confusion once lived. Darius learned that closing demonic doors is not about fear of the enemy, but obedience to God. The enemy flees when doors are shut through repentance and truth.

Darius understood that freedom is maintained by guarding your life, your choices, and your heart. He learned that God's protection flows where obedience lives. When demonic doors are closed, God's peace is free to reign.

Praying to affirm your identity in Jesus Christ means agreeing with what God says about you instead of what your past, your feelings, or other people have spoken. Through prayer, you declare that you are who God calls you to be, even when your circumstances do not reflect it yet. As you pray, lies are exposed and replaced with

truth, and confidence rooted in Christ begins to grow. Affirming your identity in prayer strengthens faith and helps you walk with purpose and assurance. When identity is settled in Christ, confusion fades and spiritual stability is established.

DAY 7 CASTING DOWN IMAGINATIONS

Encouraging Words from Cornell C. S. Wheeler (Servant)

This day we encourage you to prayerfully study this topic and read the full chapter connected to today's scripture.

Winning the Battle of the Mind:

The battlefield is not always in the streets. Often, the greatest battle is in the mind. The enemy does not need to destroy your body if he can confuse your thinking. That is why the Word of God instructs us to cast down imaginations.

The Bible teaches in **2 Corinthians 10:5 KJV**, *Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ.* This scripture reveals that not every thought that enters your mind belongs to you, and not every thought deserves to stay.

Imagination becomes dangerous when it rises above the truth of God's Word. When the mind begins to replay fear, lust, offense, doubt, or fantasy, those thoughts attempt to exalt themselves above what God has already spoken. Left unchecked, imagination can shape behavior, weaken faith, and open doors to sin.

Casting down imaginations is an act of spiritual authority. It means you refuse to agree with thoughts that contradict God's truth. You do not entertain them. You do not reason with them. You bring them under submission to Jesus Christ.

The believer must learn to replace imagination with revelation. What God says must be greater than what you feel, see, or imagine. When thoughts rise that do not align with Scripture, they must be confronted with the Word of God, not ignored.

Victory in the Christian life is directly connected to victory in the mind. When imaginations are cast down and thoughts are brought captive to Christ, peace is restored, clarity returns, and obedience becomes possible.

Today, make a decision to guard your mind. Do not allow imagination to rule where truth should reign. The Word of God has given you authority. Use it.



DAY 8 DELIVERANCE FROM THE SPIRIT OF FANTASY



Bringing the Mind Back Under Truth

Fantasy becomes dangerous when it replaces truth. While imagination itself is a gift from God, fantasy that pulls the mind away from reality, responsibility, and obedience becomes a stronghold. The enemy often uses fantasy as a quiet distraction before it becomes a loud bondage.

The Word of God tells us in **Colossians 3:2 KJV**, *Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth.* This scripture teaches us that the believer's mind must be intentionally directed. If the mind is left unchecked, it will wander into places God never intended it to live.

Fantasy often appears harmless. It starts as daydreaming, escape, or entertainment, but over time it can create false expectations, ungodly desires, and dissatisfaction with real life. Fantasy convinces people to live in what could be instead of what God is actually doing. It causes people to fall in love with an image instead of submitting to truth.

Deliverance from fantasy requires discipline of the mind. God does not deliver us so we can drift. He delivers us so we can focus. When fantasy rules the mind, prayer weakens, obedience becomes delayed, and discernment grows dull. That is why the Bible calls us to sobriety of mind and clarity of thought. Don't get drunk on demonic fantasies.

The believer must choose truth over escape. God never intended for His people to survive by imagination alone. He intended us to walk by faith, grounded in His Word. Fantasy fades when the Word takes root. As Scripture fills the heart, imagination is brought into alignment with God's purpose.

Deliverance from fantasy is not just about stopping wrong thoughts. It is about filling the mind with what is true, pure, and holy. When the mind is submitted to God, fantasy loses its power and clarity returns.

Today, God is calling His people back to focus. Back to discipline. Back to truth. When fantasy is cast down, the mind becomes a place where God can speak clearly, lead faithfully, and reign fully.
